


Our en-suite cabins provide a cosy and sophisticated haven in which to relax and savour the glorious scenery.



CASTLES, CLANS AND COASTLINES

Escape to the great outdoors where swathes of pine forest meet mighty rivers and captivating ruins are mirrored in pristine lochs. Scotland's rich history is reflected in its magnificent mansions and estates, passed down through generations.

BALLINDALLOCH CASTLE

This multi-turreted, 16th-century castle beside the River Spey is also a family home to the Macpherson-Grants, who have lived here since 1546. As well as a fine collection of 17th-century paintings, it has wonderful gardens, an exceptional nine-hole golf course and a newly opened "single estate" distillery, which is the first of its kind in Scotland.

THE CAIRNGORMS

The National Park is home to Britain's highest mountain range, ancient Caledonian pine forests and crystal-clear rivers and lochs. At its heart is the Rothiemurchus Estate, a breathtaking setting for country pursuits such as clay pigeon shooting, hill walking, fishing and spotting birds, including the eagerly awaited osprey in summer.

FOULIS CASTLE

Seat of the Clan Munro for more than 700 years, this imposing Georgian mansion (a replacement for the original castle razed by the Jacobites) is set within stunning grounds overlooking the Cromarty Firth. Highlights include a display of clan tartans and memorabilia, an early Victorian kitchen and a spectacular courtyard garden.

GLAMIS CASTLE

Renowned as one of Britain's most haunted castles, the ancestral seat of the Earls of Strathmore was the childhood home of The Queen Mother. See the opulent Dining Room and Great Hall, private chapel and nature trail, where you can spot red squirrels, herons and roe deer.

STRATHISLA DISTILLERY

One of the oldest and most picturesque working distilleries in the Highlands, this is where the famous Chivas Regal whisky is crafted. Little has changed since its founding in 1786, from the old cobbled courtyard to the distinctive "pagodas".

GLENFINNAN

This beautiful village at the northern end of Loch Shiel is famous for its magnificent railway viaduct, a vision of 21 towering arches, which may be familiar from the Harry Potter films. It is also where Bonnie Prince Charlie raised his standard at the beginning of the Jacobite Rising.

KYLE OF LOCHALSH

Reached by one of Britain's most scenic routes, this is the gateway to the Isle of Skye. The journey there is an exhilarating ride past the Torridon Mountains, along pretty Loch Carron to Plockton, whose nearby waters are home to wild seals.

EDINBURGH

Dominated by its hilltop castle, the Scottish capital blends historic landmarks, including Mary, Queen of Scot's former hideout, the Palace of Holyroodhouse, with contemporary attractions such as Michelin-starred restaurants, rooftop bars and world-famous festivals.

TRAIN JOURNEY

MAJESTIC ENGLAND

3 NIGHTS

This three-night journey from Edinburgh to London packs in many regal destinations, from Alnwick Castle to the royal Norfolk retreat of Sandringham.

Day 1 Depart Edinburgh Waverley Station in the early afternoon and journey towards Alnmouth on the East Coast. Alight for a visit to medieval Alnwick Castle, home of the Duke of Northumberland's family for 700 years. Continue to Scarborough where the train stables for the night. An informal dinner is served. Day 2 Visit the ancient walled city of York, where you have the opportunity to enjoy renowned attractions such as the Minster or the National Railway Museum, or stroll and shop in the atmospheric



Shambles. Journey to Sandringham for a tour of Her Majesty The Queen's Norfolk retreat, built in 1870 and set in 24 hectares of stunning gardens. The train rests at Dereham for the night as you enjoy an informal dinner. Day 3 Arrive in Cambridge, home to the celebrated 800-vear-old university. Visit King's College, founded in 1441 by King Henry VI, and enjoy a leisurely punt on the River Cam with impressive views of the university colleges. The train stables near Peterborough, where a formal farewell dinner on board is followed by entertainment. Day 4 After a leisurely

A formal dinner and lively Scottish entertainment enhances your final night on board.

Day 5 Travel south, crossing the Firth of Forth via the Forth Railway Bridge, to Edinburgh, where you disembark at the end of your journey.

The ultimate treat for connoisseurs, this journey in partnership with The Scotch Malt Whisky Society—the world's foremost malt whisky club—combines fascinating tours with delicious tastings.

a "wee dram" as you glide through the former Kingdom of Fife. Arrive in Keith for an informal dinner on board.

Day 2 Disembark to visit the Glen Ord Distillery before enjoying the scenic journey to Kyle of Lochalsh. Alight at Plockton for a boat trip to see the seals. Back on board, you will enjoy a formal dinner.

Day 3 Rise early for a scenic trip to unforgettable Eilean Donan Castle, one of Scotland's

most enduring images. Before lunch on board, a specialist single-cask whisky tasting is offered as the train travels to Inverness. At Carrbridge, visit the Glenlivet Distillery or head to Ballindalloch Castle, where you can play a round of golf on its nine-hole course.

Day 4 Travel to the Cairngorms' Rothiemurchus Estate to enjoy some country pursuits, such as fishing or clay-pigeon shooting. Your next whisky experience is a VIP tour at Tullibardine Distillery in Blackford.

Non-whisky lovers may prefer to visit Glamis Castle and its beautiful gardens. Formal evening dinner and Scottish country dancing on board.

Day 5 During breakfast, leave Dundee to return to Edinburgh.





THE HIGHLAND JOURNEY

2 NIGHTS

An exhilarating two-night adventure into the heart of the Highlands combines breathtaking scenery and outdoor pursuits with a visit to a renowned distillery.

Day 1 Depart Edinburgh in the early afternoon. Before long the rolling hills of Perthshire are replaced by the dramatic peaks of the Highlands. Arrive at Boat of Garten, on the private Strathspey Railway. An informal dinner is followed by evening entertainment on board.

Day 3 Enjoy a hearty full Scottish breakfast as the train travels south, crossing the magnificent Firth of Forth Railway Bridge before pulling into Edinburgh Waverley Station, where you disembark.

THE CLASSIC JOURNEY

4 NIGHTS

Encompassing the best of the Highlands, this four-night journey includes great castles, the picturesque village of Plockton and outdoor pursuits in the Cairngorms National Park.

Day 1 Set off in the early afternoon and follow the scenic East Coast to the market town of Keith. Enjoy an informal dinner and entertainment on board.

Day 3 Alight at Wemyss Bay for the ferry crossing to the enchanting Isle of Bute, home to Mount Stuart, an eccentric Victorian-gothic fantasy home of the eccentric third Marquess of Bute. Return to the train for a sumptuous formal dinner and join fellow passengers in the Observation Car for a drink or coffee and listen to traditional Scottish music.

Day 4 Return to Edinburgh.

HERITAGE HOMES AND GARDENS

4 NIGHTS

Romantic castles with outstanding gardens are showcased on this guided tour. which is hosted by an expert horticulturalist, photographer and garden writer.

Day 1 Enjoy afternoon tea as you travel up the East Coast to Montrose where you alight to visit the spectacular Brechin Castle Gardens. Continue north to Keith for an informal dinner and entertainment on board. Day 2 Travel to Dingwall to visit Foulis Castle, seat of the Munro clan for 700 years. Return to the train for a delicious lunch as the train travels along the sublimely scenic route to Kyle of Lochalsh. At Plockton, alight to visit the

expansive Attadale family estate on the west coast.

Day 3 Visit the mystical Isle of Skye and the 20,000-acre Clan Donald estate, which includes restored historic gardens and the ruined Armadale Castle. In the evening, disembark at Carrbridge for a reception at Ballindalloch Castle, home of the Macpherson-Grant family.

Day 4 Try your hand at an outdoor activity or learn about the ancient Caledonian pine forests at Rothiemurchus Estate in the Cairngorms before proceeding south to Dunkeld to visit Ruthven House. Your final horticultural highlight is beautiful Pitmuies Garden, before enjoying a formal dinner back on board.

Day 5 Return to Edinburgh.





THE GRAND NORTH WESTERN JOURNEY

7 NIGHTS

An exhilarating seven-night adventure that combines the highlights of the Highlands with the wild delights of western Scotland.

Day 1 Leave Edinburgh and travel up the scenic East Coast to Keith. After an informal dinner, enjoy rousing Scottish entertainment. Day 2 Join a tour of Glen Ord Distillery before travelling to Plockton for a boat trip to spot wild seals. A formal dinner awaits on board.

Day 3 Visit Ballindalloch Castle. In the evening, an informal dinner is served on board at Boat of Garten. Round off the evening listening to fascinating local tales from a Highlander. Day 4 Try outdoor pursuits and explore the Rothiemurchus

Estate in the Cairngorms National Park. Journey south for a private tour of Glamis Castle before enjoying a formal dinner back on board.


